## Welcome to St John's Primary School

This pack has been put together through collaboration between the school and the parents of past reception classes. The aim is to provide new parents, in any year group, with basic information, especially around events in the school calendar. Specific dates will be included in the regular Newsletters from the school, as far in advance as possible.

There may be additional events throughout the year, such as information evenings or charity days, which are not included in this pack. We will strive to give you as much notice and information regarding these as possible, to allow you to make adequate plans.

If you have any questions about anything regarding the school, your child or events that are taking place, please do ask, however trivial they may seem. We are always happy to help.

### Some helpful information

- ❖ Each class is known by a woodland animal name, e.g., Reception Rabbits. The school is divided into Key Stages: EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) for Reception class; KS1 (Key Stage 1) for Years 1 – 2; KS2 (Key Stage 2) for Years 3 – 6.
- ❖ The Friends of St John's is a registered charity and is run by a group of parents to raise money for the school (<https://www.pta-events.co.uk/stjohns-redhill/index.cfm>). They organise a lot of the fundraising events and would always welcome any help from other parents. So please do get involved.
- ❖ Each class will be asked to nominate at least 2 parents every year, to take on the responsibility of 'class rep'. The aim of this role is to be the link between the Friends and the parents, with communication and confirmation of events and activities being their primary concern. Your class rep is often the best person to go to with any questions concerning any events.
- ❖ Parent help is relied upon and encouraged by the school. If you would like to help in the classroom or on school trips, you will need to have a school DBS check. The school office can help you organise this.
- ❖ The online payment system (Tucasi) can be found at [www.scopay.com](http://www.scopay.com). This will be initiated within the first 2 weeks.

## Partnerships with Parents

We believe that it is vital that the school and parents work together closely and we will strive to develop this partnership. We will ensure that parents are kept fully informed about events in school by using Arbor to provide you with information from the class teacher, and through our notice board in the playground and regular newsletters. We frequently update parents about the progress of their child and in return we ask parents to share with us knowledge about their child. We are keen that parents feel welcome in school and very much value the time and energy that some parents are able to give as volunteer helpers.

## Your Child's Progress

During the course of the school year there will be three occasions when parents are invited to meet the class teacher. In the Autumn and Spring Terms you are invited to talk to your child's class teacher at Parents' evening; view their work and discuss your child's progress and their targets. In the Summer Term, a written report will be sent to you informing you about your child's progress, a parent drop-in session is offered if you feel you would like to discuss it further. Parents are welcome to make an appointment with the class teacher at any other time to discuss their child's progress.

## Transition

We liaise very closely with feeder settings before our new intake joins the school in Reception and have close links with our secondary schools too when our pupils leave us at the end of year 6.

## Homework

We expect parents to help children and support their learning. All children have a Reading Record for recording daily reading and for communicating between the child, parents and teachers. Regular homework is sent home in a Homework Book weekly with the expectation being that work set is completed. Children are expected to read, practice spellings, number bonds, times tables regularly in addition to set homework.

## Home School Liaison Worker

We have a Home School Liaison Worker, Miss Beardwell, who is available to support parents and pupils or act as a link communicating between school and home. She is contactable via the office.

## Parental Concerns

As a school, we are keen to quickly resolve any parental concerns. If for any reason you have questions or concerns about your child, in the first instance please talk to your child's class teacher. If these concerns are not satisfactorily addressed, then please contact the Head Teacher. Our policy is available on our website.

## Friends of St John's

The Friends of St John's School is a registered charity and is a very supportive group of parents who actively support the school. Every parent of a child in the school is automatically a member of 'The Friends' and many attend regular committee meetings, get involved with social and fundraising events and help plan new ventures. We have a 'Friends' notice board in the playground which will keep you informed of forthcoming events. In addition, there are Class Representatives of the Friends who liaise with the parents in their particular year group.

### School Communication

The school uses the following on-line systems, which can be accessed via your smart phones:

**Arbor:** Arbor is a user-friendly platform offering a Parent Portal and App where guardians can access detailed information about their child's attendance and allows parents to update information about their child. It allows easy switching between multiple children's profiles, helping parents stay informed and engaged with their child's education. We also use Arbor to notify parents if their child has had a bump to their head during the

school day and so parents are aware that they may need to keep an eye on them when they get home. Obviously, if your child sustains a serious injury or we are concerned, the school will **always** contact the parent directly.



**Tucasi (aka Scopay):** The school is 'cashless' and will accept online payments for school dinner payments for KS2, for trips and Breakfast and After School Club.

We run a daily breakfast club at St John's. This is available to all parents at a charge and is open from 7.30am until school starts.

### After School Club

We run a daily after school club at St John's. As with breakfast club it is available to all parents at a charge and is open from 3.05 until 6.00pm.

## Attendance and Lateness

One of the most important things that you can do to support your child in their learning, is to ensure that they attend school regularly and arrive punctually every morning. There is no doubt that attendance and attainment are very closely linked and parents are expected to support the school by ensuring that their child attends school as much as possible and arrives at school, on time, every morning. The timings of the school day are available in this booklet. Our attendance policy is on the school website. Holidays will be unauthorised as they should not be taken during term-time.

## Charging Policy

The curriculum of the school is broadened and strengthened by providing additional opportunities to improve learning outcomes. Unfortunately, parents may need to be asked for voluntary contributions towards many of these:

- Day visits to museums, farms, concerts, etc.
- Visiting performers to the schools e.g. musicians, theatre groups
- DT, craft and cookery activities where on completion the finished product is taken home
- Sporting activities e.g. swimming
- Residential visits (KS2)

We do appreciate that financial contribution may be difficult for some parents. In such circumstances they are invited to apply, in the strictest confidence, to the Head Teacher for support.

## Local Visits

During the year all the children participate in a variety of local trips and visits to enhance our Community and Outdoor Drivers. We frequently visit the local common area and take our learning outside the school grounds. Upon entry to school, every parent is asked to fill in a permission form for local school activities outside the school premises so that we have your permission for this on file.

## Extra-Curricular Activities

A range of clubs are held at St John's (normally from Year 1 upwards), both at lunchtime and after school, that change termly. A letter is sent to parents at the beginning of each term via Arbor to let you know which clubs will be running and how to sign your child up for a club.

## Music Tuition

Instrument lessons are available to children through Surrey Arts. Tuition is given by peripatetic music teachers to individuals or small groups of children. The charges for these lessons are set by Surrey Arts and pupils receive tuition during school time.

## School Lunches

Hot meals are currently cooked in our kitchen by Surrey Twelve15 (<https://www.itstwelve15.co.uk/>) and we are able to offer all children a balanced and healthy cooked lunch. School Meals are provided free of charge to ALL pupils in Reception, Year 1 and 2. KS2 pupils may opt to have a paid school meal or pupils may bring a packed lunch from home, which will be eaten in the dining hall. No nuts or pineapple products to be brought onto the school premises due to severe allergies.

All Infants will be offered a piece of fruit daily, as part of a nationwide initiative to develop healthy eating habits in our youngest children. Junior children are encouraged to bring a piece of fresh or dried fruit or vegetable for their mid-morning snack at break time (not pre-packaged or sugar coated). Every child is encouraged to bring a named water bottle into school daily. This can be refilled as necessary.

## Pupil Premium & Free School Meals

In 2011/12 the Government launched Pupil Premium Funding. This funding enables the school to support children from lower income families. With this money, we can fund additional teaching assistant time in classes, etc. We are accountable for how we have used this additional funding to support these pupil's specific needs and are required to publish online information about its use to ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the outcomes and progress for these learners. If you are registered for Free School Meals, you could also be eligible for help with costs of school trips. Application forms are in the Pupil Information & Consent booklet, or alternatively please ask the school office for a form. We urge all of our parents to complete this form.

***No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming. All enquiries and applications are kept in the strictest of confidence.***

## Disability, Equality & Accessibility

The school is committed to ensuring equality of education and opportunity for staff, pupils and all those receiving services from the school, irrespective of disability. The school has an accessibility plan, and has identified and addressed improvements to the physical environment to improve access to resources. The school is committed to working closely with pupils and parents/carers with disabilities in developing its Disability Equality Scheme.

Pupils at St John's are able to access all of the learning facilities, irrespective of disability. It is the school's policy to promote equality of opportunity, eliminate discrimination and harassment and promote positive attitudes to and among all pupils and staff, irrespective of disability, medical or special needs.

## Inclusion

At St John's we value all children as individuals with a range of abilities, aptitudes and needs, including medical needs. We are committed to inclusion and will make appropriate arrangements for all children to participate as fully as possible in learning, physical, practical and extra-curricular activities. Meeting the needs of children who are more able, those with Special Educational Needs or medical needs is a shared, whole school responsibility and appropriate provision is made by the class teacher for all children within their classroom. However, there will be occasions when spending time outside the classroom on an individual or small group basis will be more appropriate.

At all times parents of children with additional needs are kept informed about the support that is being made available and the procedures involved. There is a named SENCO (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator) and a member of the Governing Body is nominated as having specific responsibility to ensure the school's policies are reviewed and support is appropriate to meet the needs of the child.

## Jewellery

Jewellery should not be worn with the exception of a non-expensive watch and small stud earrings for pierced ears. Earrings must not be worn on a PE or swimming day as the children cannot wear earrings for sport sessions and the staff are not permitted to remove them. We recommend that if your child is having their ears pierced that you have this done at the start of the summer holidays, as they will be unable to participate in PE wearing earrings.

## Mobile Phones

Year 6 pupils (and year 5 pupils in the summer term with written parental permission) who walk home alone may bring mobiles to school if parental permission is given. Mobiles must be named, switched off and placed into the designated box in school to be locked away.

## School Policies

School Policies are available on our website or from the school office on request.

## GDPR: Privacy and Data Protection:

We, St John's Primary School, are a data controller for the purposes of the Data Protection Act. We collect personal information from you and may receive information about you from your previous school and the Learning Records Service. We hold this personal data to:

- Support your child's learning;
- Monitor and report on your child's progress;
- Provide appropriate pastoral care, and
- Assess how well we are doing.

Information about you that we hold includes but is not limited to your child's contact details, national curriculum assessment results and attendance information. **We will not give information about you to anyone without your consent unless the law and our policies allow us to.** GDPR came into force on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018. It is similar to the old Data Protection Act, but it has reinforced individual's rights around consent, and the protection, retention and loss of personal data. Our updated Privacy Policy and Data Protection Policy is on our website ([School policies](#)).

## Keeping Safe

- All visitors are asked to sign in and to wear a visitor's badge. The Child Protection Advice & Emergency Procedure is located on the front desk next to the visitor sign in sheet.
- All staff and volunteers at St John's have to have an enhanced police clearance check (DBS) and our recruitment procedures are very focused on ensuring that everyone who works in the school takes your child's safety seriously.
- We are required by law to report any concerns that we have about your child, in terms of physical, social, emotional or sexual abuse, to the correct authorities. As your child's welfare is of paramount importance, we hope that parents will understand if we need to take such action.
- If any parents or carers have concerns that they would like to discuss with the school, please make an appointment to speak with the Head Teacher.
- The Head Teacher is the School's Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) and the Deputy Head Teacher, SENCo and HSLW are the Deputy DSLs.

## School Uniform

Pupils at St John's are encouraged to wear full school uniform to school each day as we believe that a uniform provides a strong school identity and shows the importance of being part of the school community. Parents are asked to support us in this regard.

### Uniform – Autumn Term and Spring Term

White polo shirt with logo, without a tie (infants – Reception to Yr2)

White shirt with a stiff collar and school tie (juniors – Yr3 to Yr6)

Grey skirt or pinafore dress, trousers or shorts

V-neck sweatshirt, v-neck green jumper or v-neck cardigan with school logo

Grey or Black socks to be worn with trousers or shorts

Grey or green tights or white or grey socks to be worn with skirts or dresses

Smart heeled black school shoes. Trainers are NOT suitable for school. For younger children please select shoes with simple fastening e.g. Velcro.

Green and white checked dress with white socks

Green drawstring PE bag

No keyrings to be attached to bags and pencil cases are not required as stationery equipment is provided

**Labelling:** Please ensure that all school uniform is clearly named. Lost property is stored in the cupboard in the entrance area. Unnamed and unclaimed uniform is eventually disposed of.

**PE Lesson Days:** We ask the children to wear their PE kits to school, on the days they have a school PE lesson (day to be confirmed by the class teacher). Earrings should not be worn on PE days and all shoulder length hair must be tied up. If the children have an after-school sports club, they will come to school in school uniform and bring a change of clothes, the same for any matches after school.

The gates are opened daily at 8.30am and children come directly into the school building from 8.45am via the cloakroom doors.

Parents/carers of infant children must remain onsite until 8.45am but parents of junior children may drop them in the playground and leave as a member of staff will be on playground duty from 8.30am.
