All year 3 and 4 children to receive quality swimming teaching, All children in 3 and 4 will be able to access 1 hour per week for 10 weeks Top-up swimming lessons for children who have not met the National Curriculum expectations for KS2.	£1500

**Intended Impact of SPG spending**

Spending will ensure the ongoing of very high levels of sports learning is delivered to all pupils and staff members to sustain high standards of development and success in school sport. A mentoring
